**2 Corinthians 11:1-11**

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Will you endure a little of my foolishness? Humor me, please. You see, the jealousy that I feel for you is God's own jealousy: I stood as witness to your marriage with Christ to testify about your purity before Christ. My fear is that you – just as our first parents were deceived by the cunning of the serpent – will let your ideas get corrupted and turned away from simple and pure devotion to Christ. I say this because when someone comes preaching a Jesus other than the one we preached, or telling you to receive a different Spirit than the spirit you received, or to accept a gospel other than the Gospel you accepted, you seem to endure it quite well. I consider myself not the least bit inferior to the “super apostles.” I may be unskilled in speech, but I'm certainly not lacking in knowledge. We have made this evident to you in every conceivable way. I lowered myself to elevate you – I proclaimed the gospel of God to you without cost. Was that a sin? I robbed other churches by receiving financial support from them while serving you. and while I was with you, I was careful not to be a burden to anyone – any time I needed anything, my Macedonian coworkers supplied what I needed. I've kept myself from being a burden to you in any way, and will continue to do so. As surely as the truth of Christ is in me, nobody in all of Achaia will prevent me from boasting. And you think I don't love you? God knows I do.

## Prayers of the faithful

## **Our response is: God of peace, hear our prayer.**

For Pope Leo XIV and other leaders of our Church, that they be guided by the wisdom of the Holy Spirit and walk with the people of God in our shared journey of faith. May civic leaders listen to the words of Pope Leo, spoken at this week's general audience: "We must not become accustomed to war. Rather, we must push against the allure of powerful and sophisticated weapons as a temptation." *(Pause for silent prayer)* We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

For the nations and peoples suffering through war and violent conflict, especially Palestine, Israel, Iran, Sudan, Haiti, Yemen, Ukraine, Colombia, Mexico, the Philippines, and so many other areas of the world, that nonviolent solutions will be found and peace will prevail. *(Pause for silent prayer)* We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

Today we celebrate Juneteenth. On this day of freedom and liberation, we celebrate with all people of goodwill that we might walk arm in arm towards justice for all. O God, breathe into us your eternal breath, that we may never tire of ensuring a flourishing life for all people, but most especially, those whose generational growth has been stifled by the trauma of being enslaved. Continue to show us your goodness, that we may have the strength to advance your kin-dom with humility, solidarity, and justice. We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

During this month of gun violence prevention, we pray for all victims: survivors and perpetrators of gun violence. Let our voices be raised asking our legislators to enact gun laws to protect all in our society, especially those most vulnerable. Let our pens write messages demanding change while also scripting words of hope and transformation, trusting that another way is possible. We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

During this month of PRIDE, may we never stop expanding the borders of love and acceptance for queer, trans, brown, black, and white bodies of all abilities. Soften hearts to welcome people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions, in all of the bodies in which they encompass. Teach us to learn and relearn, with humility, excitement, and joy. We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

We pray in support for the many grassroot churches and immigrant communities who are promoting justice amid the ICE raids and ongoing violence and escalation. Undaunted by the mounting tensions, insecurity, and chaos these peacemakers persist in conducting nonviolent actions, prayer vigils, and demonstrations in solidarity with immigrant communities across the country. We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

For all the members of this community who have died, especially *John Baum from Pax Christi Long Island*, that God's light may shine on them and on all we have lost. *(Pause for silent prayer)* We pray: God of peace, hear our prayer.

For these and all the intentions on our hearts tonight, let us pray to God.
