Day 1 Sat May 16 Kickoff	Drop off gear Send Off at the Athens Community Center by the Solar Array 15 E Park Dr, Athens, OH 45701 We will hear from activists and politicians including a proclamation from the mayor Farmers market is going on at the same time so you can check that out as well Board shuttles to Chesterhill Along this route, shuttle will stop at abandoned O&G well and active compressor station. We plan to stop at a small convenience store/restaurant in Chesterhill where you can use the restroom and buy snacks. No other facilities will be available until the day's end.	21.5 Driven	1:30
Day 1 Sat May 16	Following the kickoff in Athens, we will shuttle about 30 miles outside of Athens to our start in Chesterhill. Along the way we'll stop to get a better look at some oil & gas infrastructure. Once we arrive in Chesterhill we'll stop at a small convenience store where you can buy snacks and use the restroom since there are no other facilities available along the route. Our inaugural trail is 2.6 miles. If time allows we'll walk another 3.8 miles on unlined roads. The road passes through a scenic covered bridge.	6.4	5:08
Day 2 Sun May 17	Start at the Draw-bar and Hitch Pen Farm. We walk 6.8 miles on unlined roads with some nice views followed by 0.2 miles on a busier road. The last 2 miles is a really pretty road along a creek that has 3 different cement slab crossings. If it has rained you won't be able to avoid getting your shoes wet. One water break with short drive to facilities.	8.9	5:56
Day 3 Mon May 18	Day 3 is all trail through a beautiful wooded area. It has a rolling terrain with small stream crossings, climbing over downed trees etc. The first section is 5.6 miles to the water break with facility that has flush toilets close by - shorter 1.9 option is also available. We continue on for another 6.4 miles to the end point. This section has a short area that could be a little swampy and we will also be passing abandoned oil & gas infrastructure. This is our longest day, you'll be trained on Leave No Trace to supplement our one mid-day facility break.	12	12:00

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Day 4 Tues May 19	This day picks up right where we left off on Day 3 and is also all trail. Similar rolling terrain with small creek crossings, climbing over trees etc. We have 2 water breaks one at 2.7 miles in, then another 3.8 miles to the next water break. This second water break has a near by facility with flush toilets. Then almost another 3 miles to the finish. There is a large Oil & Gas facility just down the road from where we wrap up the trail for Day 4.	9.5	9:28
Day 5 Wed May 20	We start our day at Wolf Run State Park walking along the dam, the lake and through a boy scout camp. Pit latrine is available at the camp. The trail continues for a total of 4.2 miles with some areas near the lake that can be muddy. We have a 0.2 stretch on a busy road which requires extra vigilance. The remainder is on unlined roads for 2.5 miles.	6.3	5:36
Day 6 Thurs May 21	We have our last trail section of the march this morning starting at the Buffalo Hills RV Resort and following the trail for 3.5 miles until it comes out close to the Dam at Seneca Lake. The shuttles will pick us up and take us to real flush toilets at the Seneca Lake Marina which also has an ice cream window. Leaving Seneca Lake we'll shuttle another short distance again passing O&G infrastructure. The afternoon is walking 5.3 miles on unlined roads and past O&G infrastructure. We will have to watch out for brine trucks on these roads	8.8	8:05
Day 7 Fri May 22	On this day we will be walking into Salt Fork State Park. We start about 3 miles out on Fogle Rd for a lovely walk on dirt/gravel road along some nice wetland area. Next we turn onto Cadiz Rd (Route 22) for 0.7 miles which can be really busy but has a nice wide berm. The road is better once we enter the park. This is a big park and we'll be walking from the entrance to the campground which is another 5.9 miles. Facilities are available at the park office and the Eco-Discovery center.	9.5	6:20
Day 8 Sat May 23	This is our rest day where we will have family and friends join us for a rally and fun. We'll also have time to enjoy the park, catch up on sleep, do laundry etc.		
Day 9 Sun May 24	This is the beginning of the second leg of our march. We'll shuttle a distance out of the park to get past the busy roads. We walk 5.4 miles along a series of roads with woods and farmland. The morning ends at another lovely covered bridge. We pick up a shuttle here, again to traverse some busy roads and to drive to a bathroom break. In the afternoon we walk another 5 miles, mostly on unlined roads but with a 0.2 busy road that we'll also need to be careful on.	10.4	6:59

Day 10 Mon May 25	This is our first off road bike trail day. We pick it up outside of the Virtues Golf Club. The bike path is paved, (T.J. Evans Panhandle Recreational Trail) well maintained and often fenced on both sides. The morning is 3.5 miles to our water break with short drive to facilities. Second water break at 7.0 miles that also has facilities. We finish up with the last 3 miles ending at the townsquare in Newark.	9.5	6:20
Day 11 Tues May 26	Another long bike path day as we continue along the T.J. Evans Bike Path. We start at the YMCA on the outskirts of Newark and walk for 6.1 miles to our water break in Granville that has facilities and an ice cream shop! In the afternoon we walk another 5 miles to Alexandria.	11.1	7:24
Day 12, Weds May 27	This morning starts in New Albany, a major datacenter hub. We'll have our signs ready for the high visibility route walking on the sidewalk of the heavily trafficked Morse Rd. We then walk through Easton, an upscale shopping area. We'll have an early water break here after these busy 3.3 miles. Then we'll head onto the Alum Creek bike trail that is paved and all off road for the afternoon's 5.4 miles. There are opportunities to exit the trail for facilities. We end up at the Shepard branch library.	8.7	5:48
Day 13 Thurs May 28	Our final day has a later start to allow any out-of-town friends to join us. We start at Wolfe park and walk the short 2.8 miles down Broad Street's sidewalks to the Statehouse. Again we will be carrying signs. There are places along this road you'll be able to duck into to use the facilities. At the Statehouse we'll have speeches and chants outside of the capital before we head in to share with legislatures all we've learned, observed and heard over the 100+ miles.	2.8	1:52
